Insurance on the Market Place and HealthConnect

Thanks to an executive order signed by President Biden, the HealthCare.gov Marketplace was reopened for 2021 and you can enroll in health coverage through August 15th. And anyone qualifying for Special Enrollment can enroll at any time. Also those laid off may be able to get free COBRA coverage from their former employer until September 2021. Another part is that some plans selected by people up to 150% of the federal poverty level (FPL) may be covered and then HealthConnect can cover the rest of them.
